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
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


Do you plan to write another book in the future, or do you currently have

another writing project in the works?




I admire my grandmother, who helped raise me and passed away in 2016. She was full of love, light and kindness. I hope to emulate that.

My #1 goal in life was to become a professional baseball player. Although I was blessed enough to play college baseball, that is where my career ended, haha.




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
