
Tanque Verde Ridge Trail— A strenuous trail: however, the views and seasonal wildflowers are certainly worth the hike up!





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








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A Daring Desert Duo

"There's no such thing as shoveling sunshine." It's one of many things that REALTORS® John and Sylvia Olberding enjoy about Tucson. They have lived in many locations throughout the world but have come to love Tucson most of all. "We just kind of fell in love with the Sonoran Desert," John explained, mentioning the Saguaro cacti that are exclusive to their part of the world. "Growing up in Minnesota, everything was green. I appreciated that, but we have a different kind of green here," John related, speaking of their location in Tanque Verde, which means "green basin."

Sylvia and John met in Germany when Sylvia was working as an international flight attendant. Previously, Sylvia had experienced a layover in the Tucson area and described her experience: "I remember looking out over the desert and thinking, 'I would love to live here.' Never at that time did I think I would be living here." Now John and Sylvia call Tucson their home, and they are an adventurous REALTOR® team with Long Realty.

calendar planner, unlike many who have gone wholly digital. "When John asks me for anything, I say, 'Let me pull out my calendar.' One time he joked, 'Typical teacher, always got the planner out." Similar to when a teacher's lesson plans go awry and approaches and strategies must be modified to meet the new situation, REALTORS® must improvise to maintain timelines and achieve the best outcome for both buyer and seller when challenges to transactions arise.

One of the biggest differences between being a REALTOR® and being a teacher for Sylvia is the former allows more variance in scheduling. Sylvia laughed, "As far as the day-today, it's much more flexible. I have more time—except when I'm busy, and then I don't have any time. I have more time to be busy in." Working as a team, John and Sylvia can often divide up tasks to produce even more flexibility for clients. Although they will often together go house-hunting with a client or to engagements such as listing appointments, they are sometimes able to divide and conquer: "We might have to do inspections on one house and at the same time have a closing and need to meet with clients at the escrow company. It works well." John and Sylvia have two grown





children, Mark and Peter, who both commute to the University of Arizona from home. Mark, 23 years old, and a senior finishing a bachelor of science degree in criminal justice, plans to join the fire service after graduation. Peter, 21, is a junior and, upon completion of his studies and an ROTC curriculum, will become a lieutenant in the United States Air Force. Both children intend to follow in their father's path of public service.

Both John and Sylvia love camping; they own a camper as well as an RZR UTV. The camper was a necessity for John because, between dealing with rain and the hard desert ground, he was quite uncomfortable in a tent: "A camper's nice because you've got the bathroom, and you've got the stove if you want to heat something up. You've got a microwave, a sink to wash dishes in, a warm bed to sleep in." Sylvia grew up camping as well, "but in tents." Both Sylvia and John enjoy the camper and riding in their RZR UTV as well as on ATVs. Sylvia has driven the UTV before and may give it a go again but has recently let John do most of the driving: "We

took a camping trip to Patagonia, and I was driving an ATV. Due to the steep incline, it felt like I was driving straight up. I was afraid the ATV might lose its bearings. I said, 'Never again.' So I let John do most of the driving now. But maybe next trip, I'll dare to drive the UTV, the side-by-side."

John and Sylvia typically go about once a year to the White Mountains, their favorite camping event being the White Mountain UTV Jamboree in Eagar and Springerville. John was first invited to this event by one of his master sergeants while actively serving in the United States Air Force. John borrowed the master

sergeant's ATV at that time, not having one himself. Thoroughly enjoying taking in the sights of the trails when riding out after breakfast, John and the other riders came to an open-air spot where some cowboys maintained a big black kettle full of biscuits and gravy as well as coffee to go with them. As John and his fellow riders ate and drank, the cowboys regaled them with a story in rhyme and song. After this interlude, they rode on down the trails with further stops, each day totaling about 80-100 miles of distance. Stopping at a local restaurant for lunch, they rode back to the spot where the cowboys had replaced the biscuits and gravy with peach cobbler and were still offering

coffee with which to wash it down. When they arrived back at camp, a DJ provided music, food was being served, and a raffle was transpiring, "just a lot of entertainment." The next year, the master sergeant who had invited John to the Jamboree had moved away, and John had not yet purchased his own ATV. Remedying that lack the year after, he has been back annually since, with, of course, a camper. No matter what adventure John and Sylvia get into, they enjoy being together and living their life-whether spending time in the White Mountains or working to achieve the dreams of their clients who also want to make Tucson's Sonoran Desert home.



ESCAPETO THE GREAT OUTDOORS

Summer is around the corner! Here are some places where you can escape the desert heat and enjoy a fun weekend get-away.



SAFFORD RANGER DISTRICT

This recreation area is the home of the Coronado's most extensive mountain range, the Pinaleños, and topped by the highest peak in southern Arizona, 10,720 foot Mt. Graham. A scenic road named the Swift Trail (Hwy 366) leads into these unique mountains and provides access to campgrounds, forest trails, and fishing at Riggs Lake.

Arcadia Campground is the first campground visitors encounter on their way up Mount Graham by way of the Swift Trail (AZ 366). Arcadia Campground is shaded by stands of tall ponderosa pine interspersed with Gambel oaks and Arizona walnuts. Such a diverse habitat makes this an excellent area for bird watching. Watch for poison ivy!

Cunningham Campground Located high in the Pinaleños Mountains in an open, grassy stand of aspen and fir, this campground was constructed to provide a more primitive camping experience than most forest campgrounds. Nearby there are plenty of foot and equestrian trails.

SANTA CATALINA RANGER DISTRICT - MT. LEMMON


Rose Canyon Lake and Campground. This trout fishing lake is tucked away in a picture que stand of ponderosa pines high on the slopes of the Santa

Catalina Mountains. Tall trees and rocky slopes line the shore and are reflected in the lake's sheltered waters. Rose Canyon Lake Trail #37 leads around the water's edge and provides access to the lake. It is handicap accessible, from a lower parking area to a floating dock near the dam.

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resort management with Miraval. My husband, Bryn, was in a master's program that he could do remotely." At the time, Christina and Bryn were living in Massachusetts, so moving to Arizona would be quite the transition. Christina laughs as she shares, "We almost didn't move here because I thought it would be too hot for my dog!" In the end, Christina decided the dog would adapt. In July of 2009, Christina and Bryn packed their car and drove across the country. Neither one had been to Tucson before. "We moved here sight unseen!" The desert heat gave them a hearty warm welcome. Christina jokes, "We thought, 'Oh no! What have we done?"" However, it didn't take long for them to fall in love with the desert lifestyle and the city of Tucson.

As a hotel operations manager, Christina was exposed to real estate as she assisted guests that were interested in villa ownership. Her experience in the hospitality industry prepared her for real estate. "As a hotel manager, I dealt with different aspects of the business from managing employees, creating a positive guest experience, balancing budgets, and overseeing capital improvement projects. Hotel management is all about the people, not only the people on your team but the people who are experiencing the resort. Each day was different; it's the same in real estate. It requires lots of hours, hard work, and problem-solving." Christina admits her career in hotel management happened accidentally. "As a teenager, I started working at a hotel's front desk; I worked my way up from there. I loved working in that environment, and the diverse skill set it required. However, it was time for a change. Real estate was the perfect platform to use the skills that I had already acquired."

With \$36 million in sales last year, it's clear Christina has found her calling in real estate. "Real estate offers the opportunity to work hard, enjoy ongoing learning, elevate one's skillset, and engage with the community. Things that are all important to me, but equally important is the ability to have some flexibility and live life." To help find more balance between life and the demands of real estate, Christina started working with a partner in 2021. "Frank Lococo and I met at Miraval. He called me when he was interested in getting involved in real estate. I had always wanted to be part of a team. As an individual agent, it can be a little lonely. It also helps both of us get time off."

When she's not in the office, Christina loves to get out in nature to reboot. "Spending time in the outdoors allows me to do my best work. It relieves stress and is important for my overall well-being. Sometimes when I go hiking, I lose cell coverage, so it's a good way to unplug." Christina's family shares her love of the outdoors. "Bryn and I have been camping for all of our marriage. We started with tent camping, but we now own a camper." One of her favorite



camping expeditions was a road trip through Colorado. "We started in Durango, then visited Ouray, Black Canyon, the Great Sand Dunes, Colorado Springs, and Estes Park. We saw a moose in Estes Park; it was magical. They are such majestic creatures." Their 2-year-old daughter, Harper, is becoming quite the little camper as well. "She loves to go camping. She gets so excited when we are getting ready for a trip." Spending time with the family also means making time for Penelope, a 6-year-old sulcata tortoise whose favorite treat is strawberries. "She was a Christmas gift from Bryn. We saw tortoises at the Ritz Carlton, and I had jokingly said that I wanted one."

In addition to camping, Christina enjoys trail running and hiking. "It's a powerful and moving experience to be out in the mountains." The first time she hiked Mount Whitney, she did it with friends. "The hike takes a full day; you start at 8,000 feet and go up to 14,000 feet." The second time she completed the hike, it was slightly more eventful. "I was hiking with my sister when a hail storm hit!" Thunder crackled, lighting lit up the sky, and hail rained down. "I must admit it was a little scary, but it was worth it. It is such a cool feeling to be on top of a mountain like that." Some day she hopes to hike the John Muir trail; it's a long-distance trail in the Sierra Nevada Mountain range of California, passing through Yosemite, Kings Canyon, and Sequoia National Parks. There's no doubt that many more adventures lie ahead for Christina in life, real estate, and on the trail.

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
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
